


Figure 2. Drawing of Haycock's Shirehall, by Revd Hugh Owen, c.1825. Credit: SA, 6001/200, p. 195.




Figure 4. Wood engraving of Smirke's Shirehall, unidentified publication, c. 1850. Credit: SA, PR/1/568.




Figure 6. Plan of the Shirehall, with new plot laid out in blue, 1887. Credit: SA, DA5/701/1
